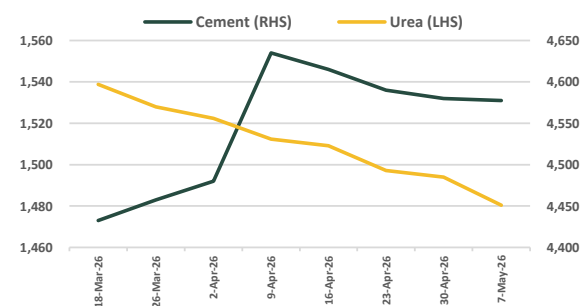

**Iran says 'smart management' plan for Strait of Hormuz finalised in parliament commission:** (Economy: Neutral to Negative)

A strategic proposal on the "smart management" of the Strait of Hormuz has reached its final stage in Iran's parliamentary National Security and Foreign Policy Commission and has been uploaded to parliament's system for review and approval, the commission's head said Wednesday. Ebrahim Azizi said the proposal aims to use Iran's geographic position in the strategic waterway as a "power-generating leverage." "The missile triad, the people and the Strait of Hormuz destroyed the product of 50 years of US efforts," Azizi said in comments carried by the state broadcaster IRIB.

**Oil slips amid Israel, Iran ceasefire uncertainty:** (Economy: Negative)

Crude oil prices pulled back on Wednesday, breaking a three-session winning streak as global markets held their breath over two pivotal developments. These included the shaky ceasefire between Israel and Iran, and a high-profile diplomatic meeting in Beijing where President Donald Trump is set to sit down with Chinese leader Xi Jinping, according to Reuters. Currently, Brent crude futures are slightly higher by \$0.18, or 0.17%, to \$107.95 per barrel, according to data by Mettis Global. West Texas Intermediate (WTI) crude futures are down by \$0.06 or 0.06%, to \$102.12 per barrel by [04:25 pm] PST.

**IMF funds arrive as govt opens pre-budget talks:** (Economy: Positive)

Pakistan has received fresh inflows of \$1.3 billion from the International Monetary Fund (IMF), which has pushed the State Bank of Pakistan's (SBP) foreign exchange reserves above \$17bn and closer to the central bank's target of \$18bn. Meanwhile, a visiting IMF mission on Wednesday began a pre-budget review of Pakistan's economy, focusing on revenue collection targets, proposed tax measures, reforms and the fiscal strategy for 2026-27. The Fund approved special drawing rights (SDR) worth 760 million for Pakistan under the Extended Fund Facility (EFF) and SDR 154 million under the Resilience and Sustainability Facility (RSF).

**Chinese firm plans \$500m export facility:** (Economy: Positive)

A leading Chinese company is establishing a large-scale manufacturing facility in Pakistan, with the potential to generate annual exports of \$400 million to \$500m and create up to 20,000 local jobs, reflecting renewed investment interest as the country seeks to boost industrial output and external earnings. This was disclosed on Wednesday by a Chinese business delegation, led by Challenges Fashion Chairman Huwang Weiguo and Challenge Apparel CEO Ms Karen Chen, with Commerce Minister Jam Kamal Khan. Both sides discussed investment in export-oriented manufacturing, industrial facilitation, tariff rationalisation, and broader Pakistan-China economic cooperation.

**July-February 2025-26: Average CPI inflation stands at 5.5pc: Ahsan:** (Economy: Neutral to Negative)

Federal Minister for Planning, Development and Special Initiatives Ahsan Iqbal said the average Consumer Price Index (CPI) inflation during July-February of fiscal year 2025-26 stood at 5.5 percent, compared to 5.7 percent during the same period last year. However, he noted that monthly inflation showed an upward trend, rising from 7.3 percent in March 2026 to 10.9 percent in April 2026. While briefing the media on the Monthly Development Update for May 2026, the Minister highlighted that during the first eight months of FY 2025-26, Pakistan's economy witnessed encouraging indicators, including lower inflation, recovery in Large Scale Manufacturing, stability in the exchange rate, record performance of the stock market, improved PSDP utilization, and rising remittances.

**Various regulatory services: Nepra allows payment of fees through digital means:** (Economy: Neutral to Positive)

National Electric Power Regulatory Authority (NEPRA) has allowed payment of fees for various regulatory services through digital means, replacing the earlier requirement of payments solely through banking instruments. In this regard, NEPRA has issued three Statutory Regulatory Orders (SROs) — 861, 862 and 863 — aimed at facilitating government companies, private sector entities, and individuals. According to SROs 861 and 862, “digital means” refers to a wide range of digital payments and financial services. These include, inter alia, online portals or platforms for payments and receipts; online interbank fund transfer services; online bill or invoice presentation and payment systems; over-the-counter digital payment facilities; and card-based payments using point-of-sale (POS) terminals, QR codes, mobile devices, ATMs, kiosks, or any other digital payment-enabled devices.

**Govt debt crosses Rs80trn mark by March-end:** (economy: Negative)

Pakistan’s central government debt crossed Rs 80 trillion mark by the end of March 2026 mainly driven by higher long-term domestic borrowing. According to the latest data released by the State Bank of Pakistan (SBP) on Wednesday, the country’s total debt stock, comprising both domestic and external liabilities, increased by Rs 2.636 trillion during the first nine months (July-March) of this fiscal year (FY26). With this increase, the central government’s debt stocks reached record Rs 80.524 trillion level at the end of March 2026, compared to Rs 77.888 trillion recorded in June 2025.

**NA passes bills to boost growth, fiscal framework:** (Economy: Neutral to Positive)

The National Assembly on Wednesday passed key economic bills aimed at strengthening the country’s fiscal framework, promoting economic growth, and introducing reforms in the financial sector. The bills approved by the lower house of parliament included the Fiscal Responsibility and Debt Limitation (Amendment) Bill, 2026; the Export-Import Bank of Pakistan (Amendment) Bill, 2026; the Special Economic Zones (Amendment) Bill, 2026; and the Netting of Financial Arrangements Bill, 2026.

**Aurangzeb leaves for China for inaugural Panda Bond ceremony:** (Economy: Neutral)

Federal Minister for Finance and Revenue, Muhammad Aurangzeb on Wednesday left for China to participate in the issuance ceremony of Pakistan’s inaugural Panda Bond in Beijing. The overall Panda Bond programme has been set at US\$1 billion, while the inaugural issuance will amount to USD250 million equivalent. The Finance Minister will attend the official ceremony marking Pakistan’s first-ever Panda Bond issuance, a landmark development through which Pakistan is gaining access to China’s domestic capital market for the first time. China’s bond market is regarded as one of the largest and deepest capital markets in the world. The ceremony will be held in the Pakistan embassy in Beijing.

**Govt rejects tax relief on inter-corporate dividends:** (Economy: Neutral)

The federal government has rejected a major relief measure for the corporate sector which originally proposed withdrawal of tax on inter-corporate dividends in the budget (2026-27). It is learnt that a proposal was drafted that the government may withdraw inter-corporate dividends tax in coming budget. However, the proposal has been rejected during the budget review meeting on Wednesday.

**Govt raises T-bill yields by up to 40bps:** (Economy: Neutral to Negative)

The government on Wednesday further increased returns on treasury bills by up to 40 basis points across tenors, marking the second hike in cut-off yields after the State Bank of Pakistan (SBP) increased its policy rate by 100bps to 11.50 per cent on April 27. The government raised Rs950 billion against the auction target of Rs1 trillion. However, it received staggering bids totalling Rs2,556bn from participants. Barring the one-month tenor, which saw an 11-bps cut, the yield on 12-month papers was increased by 40bps followed by 37bps for six-month, and by 3bps for three-month tenor.

**PM Shehbaz orders easy SME loans:** (Economy: Positive)

Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif on Wednesday directed the commercial banks to provide easy loans to women entrepreneurs and small and medium enterprises, and to assist them in exporting their products, as SMEs have full potential for the development of the national economy and for increasing exports. Presiding over a meeting to review the government’s measures to uplift SMEs, the premier expressed satisfaction with the roadmap prepared by the Small and Medium Enterprises Development Authority (SMEDA) and the Ministry of Industries, and directed that an implementation plan with achievable targets be presented within a specified time frame. He directed that processing sectors in agriculture be granted SME status, and welcomed the steps taken to include women in small and medium-sized industries.
