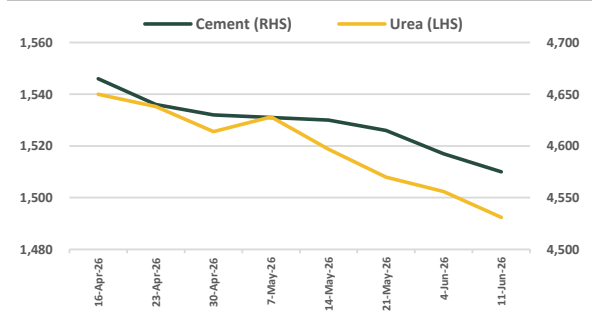

Trump says Iran deal is 'all signed', text to be released soon: (Economy: Positive)

US President Donald Trump said on Monday a memorandum of understanding aiming to end the war in the Gulf has already been signed by the United States and Iran, drawing calls from his opponents to publish the text. "The deal's all signed. And the strait is already partially opened," Trump said shortly after arriving in France for a summit of the G7 group of big economies, hailing the agreement to open the Strait of Hormuz, where a three-month blockade of Gulf oil supplies has caused global economic disruption. senior US administration official said President Trump, Vice President JD Vance and Iranian parliament speaker Mohammad Bagher Ghalibaf electronically signed a deal to end the Middle East war. "The president wanted to sign it personally because he wanted to show his... dedication to bring this through to a successful resolution," the official, speaking on condition of anonymity, told reporters in a call.

Pakistan to host signing ceremony in Geneva, PM tells NA: (Economy: Positive)

Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif on Monday told the National Assembly that the signing ceremony of a landmark US-Iran peace agreement, aimed at formally ending a conflict lasting more than three months, will be held in Geneva on Friday, June 19, and will be hosted by Pakistan. Addressing the lower house, the prime minister described the development as a "historic milestone" for global diplomacy, saying that after "three months and 16 days of tireless efforts" the US and Iran had agreed to an immediate and permanent cessation of military hostilities, including in Lebanon.

Oil falls \$4 to hit three-month low: (Economy: Positive)

Oil prices slumped around \$4 a barrel to a three-month low on Monday amid a broad selloff after President Donald Trump said the US and Iran have signed a memorandum of understanding aiming to end the Iran war and reopen the Strait of Hormuz. Brent crude futures fell \$4.11, or 4.71pc, to \$83.22 a barrel by 1:30pm EDT (1730 GMT) and US West Texas Intermediate was at \$80.54, down \$4.34, or 5.11pc. Both contracts fell to their lowest levels since March 10 on Monday after tumbling more than 3pc on Friday. WTI futures fell as much as \$5 during the session.

SBP holds key policy rate at 11.5pc: (Economy: Neutral to Positive)

The Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) of the State Bank of Pakistan (SBP) has decided to maintain the policy rate at 11.5 percent, stating that the current monetary stance remains appropriate to steer inflation towards the medium-term target range of 5 to 7 percent. The MPC in its meeting held on Monday at the SBP head office, reviewed the economic indicators and finally keep the policy rate unchanged. The committee also reiterated that it is imperative to accelerate structural reforms to strengthen the economy's resilience to supply shocks, enhance productivity, and create the necessary conditions for higher and more sustainable economic growth. The Committee noted that global oil prices have eased following the recent positive geopolitical developments, yet they remain elevated as compared to pre-conflict levels, however, the impact of the conflict is now reflecting in recent economic indicators as headline inflation rose to double digits in April and May, while core inflation also edged up.

Karachi Port records eight-year high in ship arrivals: (Economy: Positive)

The Karachi Port received over 2,000 ships in the outgoing fiscal year to record its highest ship traffic in eight years, the Ministry of Maritime Affairs said on Monday, crediting the surge to improved shipping activity and enhanced operational performance amid the Iran war, Arab News reported. Pakistan witnessed a surge in transshipment activity as the Iran war triggered shipping disruptions across the Arab Gulf, forcing global carriers to reroute their cargo through the South Asian country. Pakistan revised its international transshipment rules in March this year after the surge in shipping activity, which shipping line representatives said allowed the handling of transshipment cargo both within and outside the country's sea and air ports. A total of 2,003 ships berthed at the Karachi Port during the outgoing fiscal year, Maritime Affairs Minister Junaid Anwar Chaudhry said in a statement issued by his ministry. Ship arrivals at the port increased by 7.5 per cent while the total tonnage of ships at the Karachi Port exceeded 84.4 million tonnes.

Inflation may remain in double digits for next few months: SBP: (Economy: Negative)

The State Bank of Pakistan (SBP) expects that inflation may remain in double digits for the next few months, before gradually easing subsequently. According to monetary policy statement issued by the SBP, headline inflation rose sharply from 7.3 percent in March to 10.9 percent YoY in April and 11.7 percent in May due to rise in global oil prices and supply disruptions amid Middle East crisis. Average inflation for July-April FY 2026 was recorded at 6.2 percent, higher than 4.7 percent recorded during the same period of previous year. Apart from the low base effect, the Middle East conflict has fueled inflation directly through the hike in domestic energy prices as well as indirectly through the rise in transportation and production costs.

State Bank forex reserves expected to hit \$18bn this month: (Economy: Positive)

The central bank said on Monday that it is confident of meeting its target of \$18 billion in foreign exchange reserves for the outgoing fiscal year, with remittances expected to exceed \$41 billion. Governor of the State Bank of Pakistan Jameel Ahmad informed analysts following the monetary policy meeting that most debt repayments for FY26 have either been completed or rolled over/refinanced, except for \$700 million due in the next two weeks. The SBP expects remittances to remain above \$41 billion, approaching \$42 billion for FY26, consistent with the estimates provided in January. The bank anticipates the upward trend in inflows will continue. The SBP expects the current account deficit to remain at the lower bound of the earlier projected range of 0-1 per cent of GDP for FY26 due to strong remittances and inflows in Roshan Digital Accounts, despite higher petroleum imports. The official inflows provided critical support in meeting external obligations. These developments have facilitated ongoing FX purchases and buildup in the SBP's FX reserves.

Big industry output grows 6% YoY in April 2026: (Economy: Positive)

Pakistan's large-scale manufacturing sector maintained its growth momentum in April 2026, with the Quantum Index of Manufacturing (QIM) reaching 114.56, reflecting continued industrial momentum driven by strong performances in automobiles, garments, and other transport equipment. According to provisional data with base year 2015-16, Large Scale Manufacturing Industries (LSMI) output grew 6.06% year-on-year (YoY) in April 2026, while posting an 8.32% month-on-month (MoM) decline compared to March 2026. On a cumulative basis, the sector recorded 6.44% growth during July-April FY26, with the QIM averaging 122.19, up from 114.79 in the same period last year. The automobile sector continued its growth trajectory with a robust 83.88% increase in April and a cumulative 64.33% surge during July-April FY26.

The company said the strategic investment reflects its continued commitment to operational excellence, sustainability, and long-term value creation for stakeholders, and is expected to result in significant savings in energy costs.

Pace expands capital base by 140m shares: (Economy: Positive) (PACE: Positive)

Pace (Pakistan) Limited increased its paid-up capital from 309,862,893 shares to 450,021,219 shares after CDC allotted and credited 140,158,326 shares to certain persons/entities against non-cash consideration comprising conversion of long-outstanding TFCs, financial liabilities and a property. The shares were issued at Rs9.00 per share, representing a 10% discount to the par value of Rs10.00 per share. The shares were credited into the respective CDS accounts at the end of June 12, 2026, following CDC confirmation. The company's paid-up capital now stands at 450,021,219 shares. The closing market price of the company's shares on June 12, 2026, the date of credit into the respective CDC sub-accounts, was Rs11.53 per share. The issuance is subject to a six-month lock-in period for sale and compliance with the Listed Companies (Substantial Acquisition of Voting Shares and Takeovers) Regulations.

Waves restarts AC business after four-year hiatus: (Economy: Positive) (WAVESAPP: Positive)

Waves Home Appliances Limited (PSX: WAVESAPP) has resumed assembly operations and nationwide commercial sales of its air conditioner product line after restarting production with improved financial resources and renewed supply arrangements for imported materials. In a [notice](#) to the Pakistan Stock Exchange, the company said it had reactivated its strategic relationship with a leading air conditioner kit supplier in China, which also supplies several major brands operating in Pakistan. The first consignment of 5,000 CKD air conditioner kits has arrived, enabling assembly of both T3 and T1 models across key sizes aligned with market demand. Distribution to the company's nationwide dealer network has already begun, with products receiving encouraging market acceptance. The company had suspended production and sale of air conditioners and several other product lines in 2022, following country-wide import restrictions driven by macroeconomic pressures and monetary tightening, except its flagship deep freezers and refrigerators. Revenue from the air conditioner segment will be recognised from the current quarter and is expected to contribute positively to overall profitability. The company said the development will also pave the way for the revival of other product lines, including washing machines, microwave ovens, and water dispensers.
