

Trump pushes back Iran strikes deadline: (Economy: Neutral to Positive)

In a late-night development, US President Donald Trump pushed back his deadline for strikes on Iran’s energy assets to April 6, claiming that he was doing so at Tehran’s request, and that talks between the two warring sides were “going very well”. Last Saturday, Trump had initially given Iran 48 hours to open the crucial Strait of Hormuz to oil tankers, threatening to destroy its power plants, but has now extended the deadline twice. “As per Iranian Government request, please let this statement serve to represent that I am pausing the period of Energy Plant destruction by 10 Days to Monday, April 6, 2026,” he posted. <https://www.dawn.com/news/1985737/>

ME conflict disrupts Pakistan’s trade to GCC states, other regions: (Economy: Negative)

The ongoing Middle East conflict is poised to potentially reduce Pakistan’s direct exports to Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC) countries by USD 1.5 billion to USD 2 billion, while imports — predominantly energy — could decline by USD 3 billion. Research Economist, PIDE, stated that the ongoing confrontation between the US, Israel, and Iran in the Mideast has evolved from a regional political dispute into a global economic crisis. It could destabilise Pakistan’s local production and global exports. At the same time, high energy prices could increase Pakistan’s import bill by USD 4.5 billion. IMF shares MEFP draft as talks continue on EFF, RSF reviews: (Economy: Neutral to Positive)

The International Monetary Fund (IMF) has shared a draft of the Memorandum of Economic and Financial Policies (MEFP) with Pakistan, as both sides continue discussions virtually on the third review under the Extended Fund Facility (EFF) and the second review under the Resilience and Sustainability Facility (RSF). Officials said the sharing of the draft marks a key step towards finalising the staff-level agreement (SLA), which is expected to be announced in the coming days, subject to consensus on policy actions and macroeconomic targets. The draft MEFP includes proposed performance targets for key institutions, including the ministries of finance, energy and petroleum, the Federal Board of Revenue, and regulatory authorities. <https://www.brecorder.com/news/40413375/>

ECC approves Rs100bn TSG for austerity fund: (Economy: Neutral to Positive)

The Economic Coordination Committee (ECC) of the Cabinet on Thursday approved a Technical Supplementary Grant (TSG) of Rs 100 billion for the Prime Minister’s Austerity Fund 2026 and procurement of up to one million metric tons of wheat for federal strategic reserves under the Interim National Wheat Policy (INWP) 2025-26. The ECC considered and approved a summary submitted by the Finance Division seeking a Technical Supplementary Grant (TSG) of Rs. 100 billion for onward transfer to the Prime Minister’s Austerity Fund 2026. The Committee was informed that, in light of evolving developments in the Gulf region and their potential impact on international petroleum prices, the Prime Minister had directed the mobilization of Public Sector Development Programme (PSDP) resources to meet price differential requirements on petroleum products and to cushion consumers from price volatility. <https://www.brecorder.com/news/40413377/>

Govt may place RLNG-fired power plants on preservation mode: (Economy: Neutral to Negative)

The government is likely to place RLNG-fired power plants with a cumulative capacity of over 3,600 MW on preservation mode due to difficulties in arranging RLNG at reasonable rates, particularly after Qatar declared force majeure. According to sources, the power sector's current RLNG requirement stands at around 350 MMCFD, against which only about 80 MMCFD is being allocated by Sui Northern Gas Pipelines Limited (SNGPL). Officials warned that any decision to procure RLNG on the spot market — currently priced at around USD 25 per MMBTU from the Red Sea — would significantly worsen the gas sector's circular debt, which has already reached approximately Rs 3 trillion. However, they noted that spot purchases may still be considered in case of extreme shortages despite the financial implications.

Forex reserves rise to USD21.74bn: (Economy: Positive)

Pakistan's total liquid foreign exchange reserves rose to USD21.74 billion as of March 19, 2026, according to data released by the State Bank of Pakistan (SBP) on Thursday. The central bank said the country's total liquid reserves stood at USD21,736.0 million during the week under review. Of this, foreign exchange reserves held by the SBP were recorded at USD16,375.8 million, while net foreign reserves held by commercial banks amounted to USD5,360.2 million. The SBP's own reserves increased by USD22 million during the week ended March 19, compared with the previous week's level, reflecting a modest improvement in the external account position.

Govt borrowing from banks almost doubled: (Economy: Neutral)

The government's borrowing from banks nearly doubled in the first eight and a half months of the current fiscal year, highlighting its increasing dependence on domestic sources to meet spending requirements amid constraints in external financing. Between July 1, 2025 and March 13, 2026, the federal government borrowed Rs2.453 trillion from commercial banks. This figure is significantly higher than the Rs1.27 trillion borrowed during the same period last year, according to the latest data from the State Bank of Pakistan. Net government sector borrowings from the banking system reached Rs886 billion in July-March FY26, compared with Rs295 billion a year earlier. Additionally, borrowings for budgetary support amounted to Rs925 billion, up from Rs599 billion during the same period last year. Under the International Monetary Fund's loan programme, Pakistan is prohibited from direct budgetary borrowing from the SBP to control fiscal indiscipline. As a result, the government is required to rely on financing from commercial banks. In July-March FY26, the government repaid Rs1.288 trillion in debt to the SBP, compared with Rs465 billion a year earlier.

SBP raises Rs466bn in fixed-rate PIB auction: (Economy: Neutral)

The State Bank of Pakistan (SBP) raised a combined Rs466.232 billion in its latest auction of fixed-rate Pakistan Investment Bonds (PIBs), held on March 26, 2026, with a settlement date of March 27, 2026. Of the total amount raised, Rs453.45bn came through competitive bids. The 15-year tenor dominated accepted competitive bids at Rs325bn, with a cut-off yield of 12.40%. The 3-year followed at Rs60.75bn with a cut-off yield of 12.50%, the 2-year at Rs38bn at 12.50%, and the 5-year at Rs29.7bn also at 12.50%. The SBP rejected all competitive bids for the 10-year tenor.

OGDC discovers gas at Sahito-1 well in Sindh's khairpur district: (Economy: Positive, OGDCL: Positive)

Oil and Gas Development Company Limited (PSX:OGDC) has made a significant gas discovery at the Sahito-1 exploratory well in the Khewari Exploration License, located in District Khairpur, Sindh. The company, operating with a 95% stake alongside Government Holdings (Private) Limited holding a 5% carried interest, reported that testing of the Lower Goru Formation (Massive Sand) yielded promising results. Drill Stem Testing (DST) produced approximately 17.2 million standard cubic feet of gas per day (MMSCFD) using a 32/64" choke, with a wellhead flowing pressure of 3,390 psi. Sahito-1 was spudded on December 24, 2025, as part of an exploratory campaign and drilled to a total depth of 3,870 meters (TVD) in the Sembar Formation. The well was completed using OGDCL's in-house technical expertise. The discovery marks an important step forward in efforts to strengthen Pakistan's domestic energy resources.

Nishat Group eyes Rafhan Maize stake at Rs9,800/share: (Economy: Neutral)

Next Capital Limited submitted a Public Announcement of Public Offer on behalf of Nishat Group linked acquirers to purchase 298,759 ordinary shares, representing 3.23% of the issued and paid-up capital, along with control of Rafhan Maize Products Company Limited. The offer price has been set at Rs9,800 per share. The acquirers include Nishat Hotels and Properties Limited, D. G. Khan Cement Company Limited, Nishat Mills Limited, Nishat Power Limited, Nishat Chunian Power Limited, Lalpir Power Limited, Pakgen Power Limited, along with Naz Mansha, Raza Mansha, Umer Mansha, and Hassan Mansha. All required documents have been dispatched to the Securities and Exchange Commission of Pakistan along with a hard copy of the Public Announcement of Offer.
