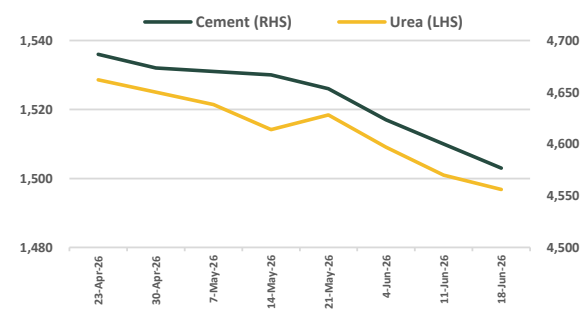

Iran, US to return to the table after fresh clashes: (Economy: Positive)

After tit-for-tat weekend strikes that threatened to derail the fragile accord, the US and Iran will return to the table with a high-level meeting in Doha on Tuesday to continue discussions on the interim peace agreement amid conflicting reports on the status of the technical talks. US President Donald Trump's top envoys, Steve Witkoff and Jared Kushner, will travel to Doha to attend the "high-level meetings", with the president saying the meeting would be held at Iran's request. "Iran has requested a meeting. It will take place tomorrow in Doha!" It is unclear if the Doha meeting would be the resumption of technical-level talks under the interim peace accord, but an Iranian official said that "unlike previous technical talks between Tehran and Washington in Switzerland, the focus would be on managing the Strait of Hormuz and de-escalating tensions"

Gulf turmoil hurting Pakistan's economic outlook: (Economy: Negative)

Regional instability continues to influence market sentiment, negatively impacting Pakistan's domestic bond and equity markets and foreign direct investment, all of which declined at the end of FY26. Several economic stakeholders were unsure whether the Gulf turmoil, which has recently paused, could last longer. They said all countries, except Israel, hoped for a permanent end to the Gulf war against Iran, but the business community was looking at the situation the other way. "Even if the war does not start in the near future, the uncertainty is high enough to keep foreign investors away from the country, such as Pakistan, which faces serious problems with its external account and depends largely on friendly countries and international donors to avoid default," said a senior banker. While the Pakistan Stock Exchange performed quite well, it has failed to attract foreign investments in the outgoing fiscal year. The data from the State Bank show that from July 1, 2025 to June 19, 2026, inflows into the equity market were \$308 million, while outflows exceeded \$1 billion.

Oil rises on war fears: (Economy: Negative)

Oil prices gained more than two per cent on Monday after attacks by the US and Iran underscored the fragility of their interim peace deal, while cautious hopes of a continued recovery in energy shipping through the Strait of Hormuz limited gains. Brent crude futures were up \$1.18, or 1.64pc, at \$73.17 a barrel by 1:35 p.m. EDT (1735 GMT). US West Texas Intermediate crude gained \$1.69, or 2.44pc, to \$70.92. Brent crude fell 10.6pc last week in a third consecutive weekly decline after crude shipments through the Strait of Hormuz rose to their highest since the US-Israeli war on Iran began in late February.

SBP exceeds \$18bn reserves target: (Economy: Positive)

The foreign exchange reserves of the SBP fell by \$1.3 billion to \$15.916bn during the week ended June 19, the central bank announced on Thursday. However, despite this massive outflow due to debt repayment, the SBP managed to achieve the \$18bn target projected for the outgoing FY26, which closes on June 30. The central bank said in subsequent days it received \$0.7bn from a multilateral institution and about \$1.7bn as refinancing of GoP commercial loans. "These inflows will be reflected in SBP's FX reserves as of June 30," said the SBP, meaning \$2.4bn would be added to the central bank's reserves in the last week of FY26. With inflows of \$2.4bn in the last week, the SBP exceeded its target to \$18.3bn. It further said the total liquid foreign reserves held by the country stood at \$21.484bn as of June 19, including \$5.568bn held by commercial banks.

Italy approves €20m agri loan: (Economy: Positive)

Italy signed a loan agreement to provide €20 million (about Rs6.3 billion) to Pakistan to support the professional capacity building and extension in agriculture project under Pakistan's Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET) National Reform Programme. The project aims to strengthen TVET system, with a particular focus on the agriculture sector, by enhancing professional skills, improving technical certification, and promoting innovation across agricultural value chains. The initiative is designed to build the capacity of farmers, extension workers, trainers, and other stakeholders through modern, demand-driven training programmes that contribute to increased productivity, sustainable agricultural practices, and improved livelihoods.

SECP says 10 IPOs raise over Rs20bn in first half of 2026: (Economy: Positive)

The SECP approved 10 initial public offerings (IPOs) for listing on the PSX during the first half of 2026, with nine companies already raising more than Rs20 billion through public offerings. The strong IPO momentum came despite regional uncertainty and geopolitical tensions, demonstrating the resilience of Pakistan's capital market and sustained investor confidence, the statement said. The offerings spanned a diverse range of sectors, including manufacturing, petroleum, dairy, Islamic finance, poultry, real estate and technology, highlighting the growing depth and breadth of the market.

Tax on imported phones allowed in instalments: (Economy: Positive)

The Finance Act 2026 has allowed Pakistani citizens to pay tax in instalments on the imported mobile phones from July 1, 2026. This is subject to the condition that all the instalments shall be paid before the end of the financial year in which the import of mobile phone is made. An individual liable to pay tax on imported mobile phone device through Device Identification, Registration and Blocking System of Pakistan Telecommunication Authority, may be allowed to pay tax in instalments as may be prescribed.

Flour prices surge in Karachi despite bumper crop, cheap diesel: (Economy: Negative)

Despite a decline in transportation costs following a sharp fall in diesel prices and the arrival of the new wheat crop in March-April, flour millers have continued to shock consumers by repeatedly raising flour prices. Since March, millers have increased the prices of various flour varieties by Rs30-38 per kg. According to the Economic Survey FY26, wheat production rose 4.3 per cent to 29.61 million tonnes from 28.40m tonnes a year earlier. On Saturday, millers issued revised prices, fixing Flour No. 2.5 at Rs6,725 per 50kg bag, 10kg flour bag at Rs1,335, super fine flour (maida) at Rs7,100 per 50kg bag and fine flour at Rs7,250 per 50kg bag, up from Rs6,300, Rs1,270, Rs6,600 and Rs6,750, respectively, prevailing on June 20. In what appeared to be a belated response, the Sindh government in the first week of June put traders and flour mills on notice over rising flour and bread prices, warning that artificial shortages and unjustified price hikes would not be tolerated. As flour prices continued to climb, Chief Minister Murad Ali Shah in mid-June ordered the immediate purchase of 200,000 tonnes of wheat from Pakistan Agricultural Storage and Services Corporation (Passco) and directed a province-wide crackdown on hoarding after reports showed the government had procured only 81,348 tonnes from the FY26 crop against a target of one million tonnes.

Karachi Port handles 24,000-TEU vessel in operational milestone: (Economy: Positive)

MSC Loreto, one of the world's largest container vessels, arrived at the terminal on Monday. The Karachi Port Trust (KPT) welcomed the vessel, marking another significant milestone in Karachi Port's growing capacity and world-class port infrastructure. Measuring 399.9 metres in length and with a carrying capacity of 24,346 twenty-foot equivalent units (TEUs), the ultra-large container vessel arrived carrying 3,802 TEUs destined for Karachi. Its arrival uncovers Karachi Port's capability to efficiently and safely handle some of the world's largest container ships. According to KPT, this achievement reflects ongoing investments in port infrastructure, modern terminal facilities and improved operational efficiency.

Arif Habib consortium takes over PIA management: (Economy: Positive)

The federal government formally transferred management control of Pakistan International Airlines (PIA) to a private consortium led by Arif Habib Corporation after completing the first phase of a privatisation deal of Rs135 billion for 75 percent stake. The Privatisation Commission said the "First Closing" became effective after the consortium fulfilled all conditions under the Share Purchase and Subscription Agreement signed in January, allowing it to assume management control of the national flag carrier. Under the transaction, the consortium paid Rs10 billion to the government and injected Rs80 billion into Pakistan International Airlines Corporation Ltd (PIACL) as fresh equity. The consortium has also committed to inject another Rs45 billion into the airline within 12 months under the "Second Closing." It has further indicated it will exercise a call option to acquire the government's remaining 25 percent stake for an additional Rs45 billion, a transaction that has yet to take place. If completed, the total value of the deal would reach Rs180 billion over time.

OGDC brings Bobi Deep-1 into production: (Economy: Positive) (OGDC: Positive)

OGDC has commenced production from the Bobi Deep-1 well in District Sanghar, Sindh, following an oil discovery at the Massive Sand of the Lower Goru Formation disclosed on June 3, 2026. The well is currently producing 2,000 Barrels of Oil Per Day (BOPD). To accelerate monetization, OGDC completed the laying of a 4-inch, 1.5 km flowline from the well site to Bobi Plant, enabling early production from the discovery. OGDC holds 100% working interest as Operator in the Bobi and Dhamraki Mining Lease. The company said production from Bobi Deep-1 would support domestic energy supplies and reduce reliance on imports.

SLM Tyres expands truck, bus radial tyre capacity by 25%: (Economy: Positive) (SLM: Positive)

Service Long March Tyres Limited (PSX: SLM) has enhanced its production capacity for Truck and Bus Radial tyres from 1.6 million tyres per annum to 2 million tyres per annum, representing an increase of approximately 25%. The expanded capacity is expected to enable the company to better cater to growing demand in both domestic and export markets, further strengthen its market position within the industry, and generate additional revenues and profitability.
